Have you recently assumed responsibility for directing a TRIO, GEAR UP, or other College Access or Retention Program?

Do you have new professionals in college access and success reporting to you?

Discover why COE's Orientation and Professional Development Program for new College Access and Success Professionals might be a sensible investment in program effectiveness.

WHAT DOES COE ORIENTATION INCLUDE?

- 1) An individual consultation between the new staff member, his or her supervisor, and a COE Orientation faculty member to identify the staff member's most pressing professional development needs.
- 2) A full-day on-site professional development seminar to address the new staff member's most

pressing needs, enabling them to build professional relationships with colleagues and forge connections with Orientation faculty who will serve as mentors throughout the staff member's first year.

- 3) A series of one-week online modules, individually selected for the new director or staff member.

IT SOUNDS LIKE WHAT WE NEED. HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

FOR COE MEMBERS:

\$800 for the individual meeting to establish a professional development program, the on-site training, and three one week online modules.

\$1100 for the individual meeting to establish a professional development program, the on-site training, and five one week online modules.

FOR NON-MEMBERS:

\$1500 for the individual meeting to establish a professional development program, the on-site training, and three one week online modules.

\$1900 for the individual meeting to establish a professional development program, the on-site training, and five one week online modules.

IT'S WHAT WE NEED, BUT IT SOUNDS EXPENSIVE.

COE's Orientation and Professional Development Program for New College Access and Success Professionals is an allowable cost in federal college access and success program grants, and most private grants. The total cost of the program is less than one month's salary for a new professional and can often be covered by monies unspent during a staff vacancy.
