The Wolanin Internship will occur in the Spring semester of 2027. Specific program dates will be announced at a later time. Congressional placements are individualized, and timelines may vary based on office schedules and availability.

Being selected as a Thomas R. Wolanin Congressional Intern means joining a fast-paced professional environment where you contribute as part of a dedicated team. This experience demands your full attention, energy, and commitment to making a meaningful impact.

Program Restrictions

During the internship, participants may not:

- ✗ Enroll in academic coursework
- ✗ Maintain a second job or employment
- ✗ Participate in another conflicting internship or professional program
- ✗ Keep recurring commitments that interfere with COE or congressional responsibilities

This internship is a unique opportunity to build professional skills, create lasting relationships, and gain firsthand exposure to federal policymaking. Your full commitment ensures you— and the communities you represent — gain the most from this opportunity.





ELIGIBILITY

Candidates must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ An individual who has earned a bachelor's degree within the past five (5) years
- ✓ Has participated in a Federal TRIO Program (pre-college or undergraduate)
- ✓ Interest in public policy and advancing educational opportunity
- ✓ Strong written and verbal communication skills
- ✓ Adaptability and a willingness to learn
- ✓ Critical thinking and problem-solving abilities
- ✓ Commitment to teamwork and collaboration
- ✓ Technology readiness and comfort with digital tools

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Can I apply if I graduate in December, 2026?

Yes, you are eligible as long as you have completed your bachelor's degree before the internship start date.

Q: Can I choose my Congressional office?

The COE Governmental Relations Department manages the Congressional placement process for selected Wolanin interns. You may share your interests, but a particular office cannot be guaranteed.

Q: When will I know my exact internship dates?

Final dates cannot be provided until the selected candidate's Congressional placement is completed. For planning purposes, you should block your calendar from mid-January until mid-May.

Q: When will I find out if I have been selected?

Applicants will receive information about selection by the end of November.
